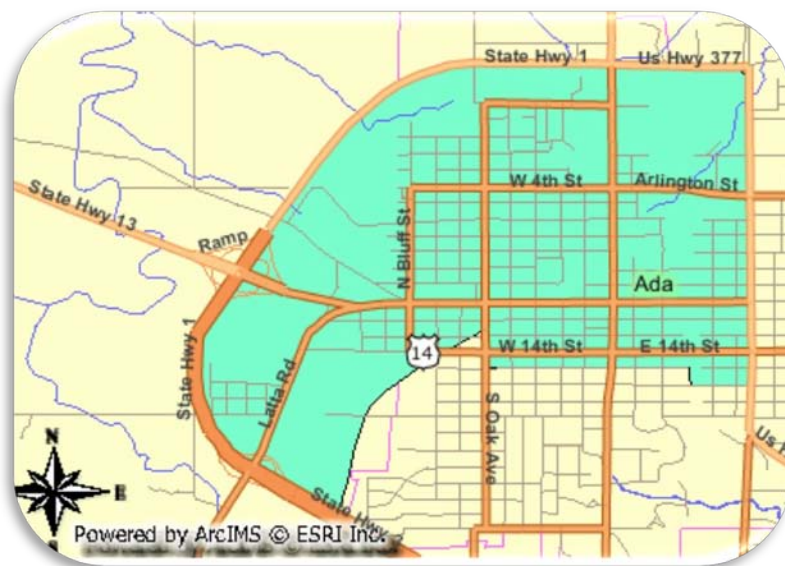


Federal Enterprise Community

Rural Round II Designation

Tri-County Indian Nation Community Development Corporation administers the Enterprise Community designation through the US Department of Agriculture. Tri-County received the Enterprise Community designation in 1998 and is the only active Enterprise Community in Oklahoma. Initiative is an interagency effort focused on the creation of self-sustaining, long-term development in distressed urban and rural areas throughout the Nation. There are federal tax incentives available to businesses locating in the area and to those employing residents of the area.



The Enterprise Community district consists of several rural Census Tracts in Pontotoc County in addition to areas within the city limits of Ada. There are areas designated in and around Ada that are not depicted by the map to the left of the original district. The Ada designation is loosely bound by the Richardson Loop, Mississippi Avenue, 15th Street, and the BNSF railroad. The district designation was recently expanded to include areas such as the CLEET campus and

the Ada Municipal Airport.

There are many development opportunities in the Enterprise Community designations in Pontotoc County. The Ada Jobs Foundation will work with your company to identify the most suitable site for your company. The Ada Industrial Development Corporation (AIDC) can purchase the property on your behalf and construct a build-to-suit structure. A lease/purchase agreement with AIDC will make your relocation to Ada profitable. Tri-County Indian Nations Community Development Corporation will pursue grants on your behalf from the US Department of Agriculture – Rural Development Administration. There are loans, tax credits and grants that are limited to Enterprise Community districts. The Ada community views ourselves as your business partner and we want to be successful.
